

A public meeting of the Chandler Heights Citrus Irrigation District was convened on Tuesday February 8, 2011 at 26651 S Valencia. Directors Joe Overton, Elizabeth Fulghum, Fred Clare, Recording Secretary Jaci Pietrzak, Field Operations Manager Alfonso Garcia were in attendance. From the public were district residents Charlene Chausse and Pat O'Malley in attendance.

Call to Order/Pledge of Allegiance

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm

Call to the Public

- Charlene Chausse asked why the people north of Riggs pay less for water than we do.
 - It was determined that when Seville was built, they bought out part of that district and the district is currently running on those reserves.

Old Business

- Elizabeth Fulghum informed the board that she spoke with the Bureau of Reclamation on February 4, 2011 regarding negotiations to lower fines of comingling water on properties less than five acres. Elizabeth said that their answer for any negotiations was no.
- Joe Overton updated on the progress of Well 5. He said the pump impeller dropped and they are going to soft brush the well starting tomorrow (February 9, 2011). Well 5 should be back up and running in a couple of weeks.
- Joe Overton updated on the progress of Well 7. He stated that the tests showed that Well 7 will be used as an irrigation well for now, unless the test that will be done after it is test pumped bring in in to compliance to be used for drinking.

New Business

- By Laws were discussed and it was determined that we can change the meeting time and day by receiving a 2/3 vote.
 - Fred Clare moved that the meeting time be changed from the second Tuesday of every month at 6 pm to the first Wednesday of every month at 7pm. Elizabeth Fulghum second the motion. The next regular meeting will be held on the first Wednesday of March 2011 at 7 pm.
- Joe Overton said that the district is going to make a bigger effort to post things earlier on the website and keep it updated.
- Alfonso Garcia the Field Superintendent presented pictures to the board of the Big Water tank being cleaned washed and decontaminated.
- The entire board encouraged the field staff to attend as much trainings as possible.
- Pat O'Malley stated that ADQ has begun charging \$75.00 to take their test and asked if a partial reimbursement would be possible if they do not pass the test by a few points. It was determined that a negotiation may be possible for that issue and would be on a case by case basis.
